13. STAFF REPORTS

A. Update on Somis Farmworker Housing

The County of Ventura is building housing for Farmworkers in Somis, immediately adjacent to Rancho Campana High School. Senior Planner, Justin Bertoline, from the County of Ventura presented information on the project to Trustees and discussed how the project supports Farmworkers in our community.

- Parcel #4, on the map presented, will remain an active crop production. Nobody will benefit from this as it's privately owned.
- RCHS isn't close to the wastewater pipeline.

- Parking will not be an issue for phases 1, 2 and 3 as there is a plan to have overflow parking available for these units, and no outside parking is available.
- Trustees understood this project is providing affordable housing for the city of Camarillo, a needed benefit for the community, despite the loss of the agricultural land.
- Construction noise isn't a CEQA issue and wasn't factored into the analysis as it's considered temporary; however, the wastewater treatment facility noise was analyzed and attenuation devices have been installed, such as a concrete block walls and exhaust mufflers. The wastewater facility only runs dependent on its need and will be run by a licensed operator.
- A demographic study wasn't done as part of the analysis, but the applicant did do one. Mr. Bertoline will try and supply this information to Trustees later.
- The units are only available for rent, not purchase.

Trustees thanked Mr. Bertoline for his report.

B. Special Education Protocols

The purpose of this presentation was to provide background information regarding the protocols of Special Education in regard to IEP compliance oversight and accountability.

- Special Education Attorney, Lee Rideout, informed Trustees that Compensatory Ed during summer school depends on each individualized situation for those school districts that are being held responsible for Special Education students.
- When a concern is brought to the Program Specialist's or Dr. Garcia's attention regarding a teacher then Dr. Garcia notifies the site administrator that oversees that teacher. The parent can also speak directly to the site administrator.
- Parents in need of specialized services for their child should first contact the student's case manager.
- Parents with concerns related to Special Education should contact the Program Specialist, a behaviorist or Dr. Garcia.
- Dr. Garcia stated there is ongoing communication between school sites and the district office Special Education office.
- Case Managers are responsible for keeping track of IEP follow through such as accommodations being implemented in the classroom. Program Specialists, Behaviorists, ParaEducators and the Assistant Principal aligned to Special Education are responsible for visiting the classrooms to make sure the accommodations are being done.
- Special Ed clerks keep track of the compliance issues and they will notify the case managers of upcoming events if they miss something. The clerks also have a Program Specialist dedicated to work with them to assist with compliance.
- Trustee Herrera would like to see Dr. Garcia and her team have more input with Principals and Assistant Principals over Special Education in terms of what needs to be done at the site level to reduce the number of settlement claims. She added that special education training for school sites, including administration and general education, has increased.
- Trustees recommended that Dr. Garcia have monthly meetings with site department chairs as they need training also.
- Trustees recommended that Dr. Garcia collect data annually for the addendum, triennial and transition IEP meetings to break down the pie chart, presented, even more to see if the figures or percentages of the initials vs. addendums vs. transition IEPs possibly show trends.
- Trustees would like to be informed of which school sites carry the Autism, Adult transition, Deaf and Hard of Hearing, and Co-Teaching, ED Programs as they are not at every district comprehensive site.
- Trustees requested information as to how 8th graders, with IEPs, are transitioned to 9th grade, information on 504 plans in future staff reports and to use OUHSD teachers to train other teachers.
- When asked what she needed, Dr. Garcia stated that she could use an additional Special Education Clerk.

Trustees thanked Dr. Garcia and her team for their report.
